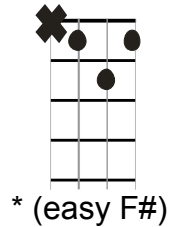
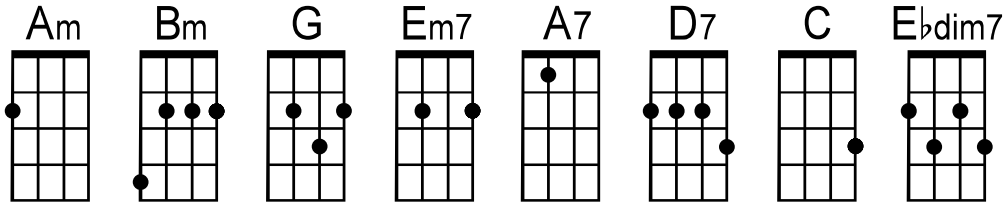


# Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer
